- (2) **It Proved that Jesus is Perfectly Qualified Morally to be the Davidic King** (Psa 2; Luke 4:5-8; Matt 28:18; Rev 11:15; cf. Col 2:15)
- (3) **It Proves that Jesus is Perfectly Qualified Morally to be His People's Savior** (Heb 9:14; 1 Pet 1:19; Col 2:15)
- (4) **It Proves that Jesus is Perfectly Qualified Morally to be a Sympathetic High Priest** (Heb 2:18; 4:15)
